

# 1. Wangari Maathai (1940 - 2011)

2. Started a grass-roots movement aimed at countering the deforestation that was threatening the survival of the farming population. The campaign encouraged women to plant trees in their local environments and to think ecologically.
3. This Green Belt Movement arranged the planting of over 51 million trees in Kenya.
4. Spoke out against Kenya's corrupt government in 1980's and 1990's.
5. In the 1990's she worked with pro-democracy groups and united against opposition against the corrupt government in Kenya.
6. Fought for Human Rights and women empowerment.
7. Won the Nobel Peace Prize in 2004 for her contribution to sustainable development, democracy and peace.
