Some key facts!

- The law states that students should be in school on time every day.
- Attendance and Punctuality are important for you to succeed at school
- **Students with attendance above 96% achieve the best grades**
- **We expect 100% attendance from all of our students, minimum expectation is 97%**
- If you are not in school, school cannot be sure that you are safe
- Any student whose attendance is below 90% is classed as persistently absent.
- All students are expected to be in school every day **by 8.40 am**
- If you are ill then a parent/ carer must contact school **before 9.00 am**
- Any concerns or questions please contact the attendance office

Punctuality to school

- All students are expected to be on the school premises every day for 8.40 am. After this you are LATE
- Arriving late to school will result in a break time detention on the same day. Failure to attend this will result in an after school detention on the same day (25 mins).

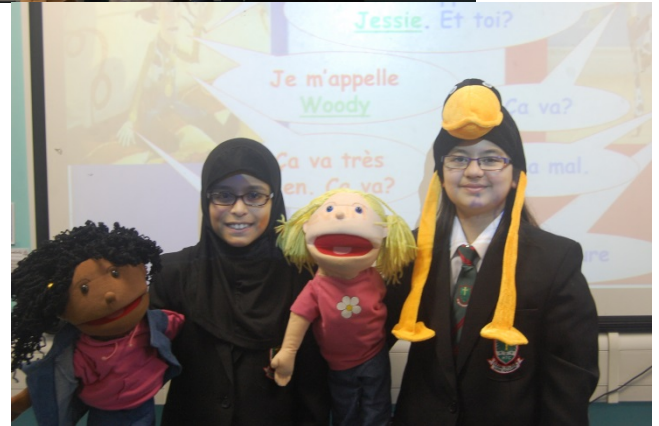
Congratulations Haseeb!
